STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS-Info

Hales (PNHS) reminded students that a college application and essay is due by February 1, 2024. They are necessary for students to be eligible for local scholarships. The applications may be found on student Navian accounts. On December 7 & 8, 141 students will be attending the DECA District 1 Conference. The top five in each category will be eligible to attend the Massachusetts State Career Development Conference in Boston on March 7-9. PNHS's Interact Club, in support of the Rotary Club, is still collecting winter items during October & November. On Thursday, November 16, the National Honor Society (NHS) inducted 42 new members. COMMUNICATIONS-Info

Superintendent's Report: Campbell, accompanied by Manomet Elementary School Principal Fraine and teacher, Nancy Cavicchi, travelled to Washington, D.C. for the Blue Ribbon Ceremony. It was noted that Manomet Elementary School was the only public elementary school from Massachusetts. Campbell has sent out invitations to families and staff requesting members for The Strategic Planning Committee. This committee will represent diversity and inclusion of all schools in the district. The meetings will run from February 5 through April 29. Included in this endeavor will be surveys and focus groups. Next week there will be School Committee meetings focusing on the budget proposal for FY25 Campbell will be establishing an advocacy group to discuss both out-of-state and out-of-country field trips. The purpose is to research groups that run - profit trips as opposed to groups that may sponsor non-profit trips.

MASC Conference

Savery gave an overview of a workshop that she facilitated Sandy Hook Promise and the Attorney General's office. They highlighted a program called Know the Signs for School Violence Prevention. The Sandy Hook Promise offers scholarships. Another program talked about the difference between Presentation and Prevention as differing methods of addressing issues. Savery mentioned there are Save Promise Clubs. Campbell has reached out to the organization that has given status to 75 schools; we are on the waiting list. Savery also attended a workshop on legal issues including parents' rights, school committee rights, as well as curriculum.

Badger congratulated Savery on her Lifetime MASC Member Award. Badger shared her review of the play, The Play That Goes Wrong, and congratulated those responsible for a great production
